WESTCHESTER COUNTY REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

I. INTRODUCTION

(A) General Information

The Westchester County Department of Finance is requesting proposals from firms in the practice of public accounting, certified in New York State, to provide Internal Audit Services for a two (2) year period with the County's option to renew for two (2) additional one-year periods. These audits shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards; the standards set forth in the U.S. General Accounting Office's (GAO) Government Auditing Standards (1988), and the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-128 Audits of State and Local Governments.

Proposals are due on Friday November 14, 2008, by 4:00 p.m.

Please take notice, by submission of a proposal in response to this request for proposals, Proposer agrees to and understands:

- that any proposal, attachments, additional information, etc. submitted pursuant to this Request for Proposals constitute merely a suggestion to negotiate with the County of Westchester and is not a bid under Section 103 of the New York State General Municipal Law;
- submission of a proposal, attachments, and additional information shall not entitle the proposing entity to enter into a service agreement with the County of Westchester for the required services;
- by submitting a proposal, the proposing entity agrees and understands that the County of Westchester is not obligated to respond to the proposal, nor is it legally bound in any manner whatsoever by submission of same;
- that any and all counter-proposals, negotiations or any communications received by a proposing entity, its officers, employees or agents from the County, its elected officials, officers, employees or agents, shall not be binding against the County of Westchester, its elected officials, officers, employees or agents unless and until a formal written agreement for the services sought by this RFP is duly executed by both parties and approved by the Westchester County Board of Acquisition & Contract, and the Office of the Westchester County Attorney.

(B) Statement of Rights

Westchester County ("the County") reserves the right to reject any or all proposals; to issue additional solicitations for proposals and/or addenda to this RFP; to select any proposal as the basis for negotiations of a contract; to waive or modify any irregularities in proposals received after notification to proposers affected; to exercise its discretion and apply its judgment with respect to any aspect of this request, the evaluation of proposals, and the negotiation and award of any contract; to enter into an agreement for only portions (or not to enter into an agreement for any) of the services contemplated by the proposals;

and to select the proposal or proposals that best satisfy the interests of the County and not necessarily on the basis of price or any other single factor.

During the evaluation process, the County reserves the right to request additional information or clarification from proposing firms, or to allow corrections of errors in submissions. At the discretion of the Commissioner of Finance, some firms may be required to make oral presentations as a part of the evaluation process.

The County reserves the right to retain all submitted proposals and to use any ideas in a proposal regardless of whether that proposal is selected or rejected. Submission of a proposal indicates acceptance by the firm of the conditions contained in this Request for Proposal (RFP), unless clearly and specifically noted in the proposal submitted and confirmed in the contract between Westchester County and the selected firm.

It is anticipated that the selection of a firm or of multiple firms will be completed by Friday December 5, 2008, however the County reserves the right to complete the selection at a sooner or at a later date. Following notification of the selected firm(s) and subject to the approval of the County's Board of Acquisition and Contract, it is expected that independent contract(s) will be executed between the County and the selected firm(s) with a starting date of January 1, 2009.

Equal Employment Opportunity: The successful Proposer must comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations pertaining to non-discrimination and equal employment opportunity.

Costs of Proposal Preparation: The Proposer shall bear all costs associated with preparing and submitting the proposal. The County shall have no liability whatsoever for such costs.

Indemnification and Insurance: The Proposer accepts and agrees that language in substantially the following form will be included in the contract between the Proposer and the County:

"In addition to, and not in limitation of the insurance requirements contained herein the Consultant agrees:

(a) that except for the amount, if any, of damage contributed to, caused by or resulting from the negligence of the County, the Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liability, damage, claims, demands, costs, judgments, fees, attorneys' fees or loss arising directly or indirectly out of the acts or omissions hereunder by the Consultant or third parties under the direction or control of the Consultant; and

(b) to provide defense for and defend, at its sole expense, any and all claims, demands or causes of action directly or indirectly arising out of this Agreement and to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto.

Upon execution of any contract between the Proposer and the County, the Proposer will be required to provide proof of the insurance coverage described in Schedule "A".

Insurance coverage in amount and form shall not be deemed acceptable until approved by the County of Westchester, Department of Risk Management. The Director of Risk Management may alter insurance requirements at his discretion.

Freedom of Information: The New York State Freedom of Information Law as set forth in Public Officers Law, Article 6, Sections 84-90, mandates public access to government records. However, proposals submitted in response to this RFP may contain technical, financial background or other data, public disclosure of which could cause substantial injury to the Proposer's competitive position or constitute a trade secret. Proposers who have a good faith belief that information submitted in their proposals is protected from disclosure under the New York Freedom of Information Law shall:

a) insert the following notice in the front of its proposal:

"NOTICE

The data on pages ___ of this proposal identified by an asterisk (*) contains technical or financial information constituting trade secrets or information the disclosure of which would result in substantial injury to the Proposer's competitive position.

The Proposer requests that such information be used only for the evaluation of the proposal, but understands that any disclosure will be limited to the extent that the County considers proper under the law. If the County enters into an agreement with this proposer, the County shall have the right to use or disclose such information as provided in the agreement, unless otherwise obligated by law."

and

b) clearly identify the pages of the proposals containing such information by typing in bold face on the top of each page " *** THE PROPOSER BELIEVES THAT THIS INFORMATION IS PROTECTED FROM DISCLOSURE UNDER THE STATE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION LAW.**"

The County assumes no liability for disclosure of information so identified, provided that the County has made a good faith legal determination that the information is not protected from disclosure under applicable law or where disclosure is required to comply with an order or judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction.

The contents of the proposal which is accepted by the County, except portions "Protected from Disclosure", may become part of any agreement resulting from this RFP.

(C) Term of Agreement

A two (2) year contract is contemplated with the County's option, in its sole discretion, to renew for two (2) additional one-year periods.

II. NATURE OF SERVICES

(A) General Information

The County is soliciting proposals for the professional services of qualified public accounting firms to provide multi-disciplinary internal auditing services. These audits are to be performed in accordance with the provision contained in this request for proposal.

(B) Scope of Work

The firm (s), under the direction of the Commissioner of Finance or her designated representative, shall conduct audits with the intent of confirming compliance with the appropriate County, State and Federal policies, rules, regulations, laws and agreements, and determine the financial integrity, economy, efficiency or effectiveness of a variety of County operations including contracts, leases, or concessions.

The County is involved in the full range of routine governmental operations and, additionally, is engaged in a number of complex private ventures, including lease agreements, the operation of an airport, bus system, water and sanitary sewer systems and an amusement park.

The tentative work schedule for 2009 is found in Section IV of this proposal. During the year additional audits may be requested. The nature of the audits can range from, but are not limited to, the following:

- audit of bus company operations
- airport operations and passenger facilities charges (PFC) collections and use
- inventory control at county warehouse and central garage
- compliance with procurement procedures at County Purchasing, and various other departments
- contract compliance of a variety of operations including: DWI, Work Force Investment Act, Youth and Aging Programs, Mental Health, food service, housekeeping, legal aid affiliation contracts, etc.
- refuse disposal operations
- billing and collection practices at various departments (e.g. County Center, Golf Courses, Health and Mental Health Clinics)
- central County payroll operations and those at Social Services
- variety of multi-year lease agreements (computers, parking, garages, building leases and equipment)
- audit of internal controls on countywide financial and human resource system
- review of internal county controls for contract management and payment
- audit of county grants
- construction contract compliance
- State aid claim process and payment

(C) Auditing Standards to be Followed

To meet the requirements of this request for proposal, the firm shall illustrate compliance with generally accepted auditing standards as set forth by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA), the Standards for Financial Audits set forth in the U.S. General Accounting Office's Government Auditing Standards, and the provisions of U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-128, *Audits of State and Local Governments*.

(D) Reports to be Issued

Following the completion of an audit assignment, the firm shall issue a written report to the Commissioner of Finance on the findings. This report shall include a review of the internal control structures, any reportable conditions found during the audit which could adversely affect the County's ability to record, process, summarize and report financial data, State Aid claims, etc.

All reports shall include: all instances of non-compliance with policies, procedures, contract, terms, etc.

Irregularities and Illegal Acts: Auditors shall be required to make an immediate written report of all irregularities and illegal acts of which they become aware to the Commissioner of Finance and the County Executive.

(E) Special Considerations

The County may request the firm to assist in training County staff for routine audits of operational areas (for example: petty cash and payment processing).

III. DESCRIPTION OF WESTCHESTER COUNTY GOVERNMENT

(A) County Contact

The principal contact with the County will be Kathy Thorsberg, CPA, Commissioner of Finance, or her designated representative. All assistance and direction on the audits will be coordinated through the Office of the Commissioner of Finance.

(B) Overview of Government Operations

To obtain a copy of the most recently completed Annual Financial Report please visit the County's official website at ***WWW.WestchesterGov.com***. ***Select "Departments", Select "Finance"; Select "Official Statements, Annual Reports, Debt Management"***.

For a Copy of the 2008 County Operating Budget, Capital Budget and Special Districts Budget, Select "Departments" Select "Budget". These documents will provide you with an overview of the operations for which Westchester County is responsible and the areas of expertise in which the selected firm must be proficient.

(C) Description of Automated Accounting System

The County's financial information system is AMS software and is known as Advantage Financial. The system has on-line financial transactions going back to January 2005 through the current period, and it provides real time on-line transactions.

The selected firm(s) will be given training in the financial system the County has in place prior to the beginning of any requested internal audit reviews.

(D) Availability of Prior Reports and Related Working Papers

Previous reports and related work will be provided upon request to the firms selected.

(E) Report Preparation and Review

Report preparation, editing and printing shall be the responsibility of the firm(s). Preliminary findings and drafts will be reviewed with the Commissioner of Finance.

Preliminary audit reports must be filed within ten (10) business days of the completion of the field audit work, and final audits must be submitted within five (5) business days of the sign-off on preliminary audit reviews.

IV. TIME REQUIREMENTS

(B) **Tentative 2009 Audit Schedule**

It is anticipated that the selected firm(s) may conduct financial and/or operational audits of various activities during 2009 which may include the following:

Financial Audits

- Bus company operations
- Airport operations
- Passenger Facilities Charge (PFC) collections and use - Airport
- Mental Health contract agency operations
- County Grants Fund
- Hotel Tax Audit

Operational Audits

- compliance of procurement procedures at Westchester County Bureau of Purchasing
- Playland Amusement Park.

This is our tentative work schedule for the 2009 fiscal year. Note that other audit assignments may be designated at the discretion of the Commissioner of Finance.

V. PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

(A) **General Requirements**

1. *General Inquiries*

Request for clarification of this RFP must be written and submitted to Kathy Thorsberg, CPA, Commissioner of Finance, 148 Martine Avenue, Room 720, White Plains, New York, 10601 no later than 4:00 p.m. on Friday October 15, 2008. Other inquiries to County personnel may be grounds for elimination from the selection process. Formal written responses, or a consolidated written response, will be distributed by County on or before Friday October 31, 2008.

2. *Submission of Proposal*

Proposals are due no later than 4:00 p.m. on Friday November 14, 2008.

Firms must submit five (5) copies of their proposal to:

The County is not responsible for any internal or external delivery delays which may cause any proposal to arrive beyond the stated deadline. To be considered, proposals must arrive at the place and time specified herein and be time-stamped prior to the deadline.

Proposals must be signed. Unsigned proposals will be rejected.

(B) Technical Proposal

1. *General Requirements*

The purpose of the proposal is to demonstrate the qualifications, competence and capability of the firms seeking to undertake the internal audit function of Westchester County. As such, the substance of the proposals will carry more weight than their form or manner of presentation. The proposal should demonstrate the qualifications of the firm and of the particular staff to be assigned to the kinds of audits listed in *Scope of Work* (II. B.).

2. *Firms Qualifications and Experience with Multi-Disciplinary Auditing Engagements*

The proposal should state the size of the firm, the size of the firm's governmental audit staff, the location of the office from which the work on these engagements would be performed, and the number and nature of the professional staff available to work on the various audits.

The firm is also required to submit a copy of the report on its most recent external quality control review, with a statement indicating whether that quality control review included a review of specific government engagements.

The firm shall also provide information on the results of any Federal or state desk reviews or field review of its audits during the past three (3) years. In addition, the firm shall provide information on the circumstances and status of any disciplinary action taken or pending against the firm during the past three (3) years with state regulatory bodies or professional organizations.

3. *Staff Qualifications and Experience*

The staff providing services must be located in the metropolitan New York area.

The firm should identify the principal supervisory and management staff, including engagement partners, managers, other supervisors and specialists who would be assigned to the various engagements and indicate whether each such person is (registered/licensed) to practice as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) in New York State. The firm should also provide information on the government auditing experience of each person, including information on relevant continuing

professional education for the past three (3) years, and membership in professional organizations relevant to the performance of these audits.

WESTCHESTER COUNTY is particularly interested in the experience with New York governmental clients of the staff expected to be assigned to the audit.

The firm should provide as much information as possible regarding the number, qualifications, experience, and training, including relevant continuing professional education of the specific staff to be assigned to these engagements. The firm also should indicate how the quality and continuity of staff over the term of the Agreement will be assured.

The County understands that engagement partners, managers, other supervisory staff and specialists may be changed if those personnel leave the firm, are promoted, or are assigned to another office. These personnel may be changed for other reasons subject to the express prior written permission of WESTCHESTER COUNTY. However, in either case, WESTCHESTER COUNTY retains the right to approve or reject replacements.

Other audit personnel may be changed at the discretion of the proposer, provided that replacements have substantially the same, or better, qualifications or experience.

4. Prior and Similar Engagements with Westchester County and Other Governmental Entities

The firm should list separately all engagements within the last five (5) years, ranked on the basis of total staff hours, for WESTCHESTER COUNTY by type of engagement (i.e., audit, management advisory services, other). For each engagement, the firm should indicate the scope of work, date, engagement partners, total hours, the locations of the firm's office from which the engagement was performed, and the name and telephone number of the principal client contact.

Similar Engagements with Other Governmental Entities: For the firm's office that will be assigned responsibility for the audit, list the most significant engagements (maximum of 5) performed in the last five (5) years that are similar to the engagement described in this request for proposals. Again, experience of the proposed staff with New York State counties or large municipalities is especially important. These engagements should be ranked on the basis of total staff hours.

Indicate the scope of work, date, engagement partners, total hours, and the name, address and telephone number of the principal client contact.

Indicate separately a list of all governmental clients in the State of New York.

5. Special Considerations

Identification of Anticipated Potential Audit Problems - The proposal should identify and describe any anticipated potential audit problems, the firm's approach to resolving these problems and any special assistance that will be requested from WESTCHESTER COUNTY.

(C) Hourly Rate Schedule

1. Rates for Partners, Supervisory Staff, and Staff Accountants

The firm should provide a schedule of hourly rates for various staff that would be assigned to the audit — partners, manager, seniors, staff accountants, and any other staff that could be

assigned. Although we are not requesting hours per assignment, please provide a percentage breakout of the time routinely spent, by staff level.

2. *Out-of-Pocket Expenses and Expected Reimbursement Rates*

The firm should identify what, if any, routine out-of-pocket expenditures could be incurred. It is the County's policy not to reimburse for extraordinary travel costs.

(D) Evaluation & Selection Criteria

The County reserves the right to weigh its evaluation criteria as it deems appropriate, and may at its discretion request any or all firms to make oral presentations. It is anticipated that up to three (3) firms may be selected, and following notification of the firms selected and subject to the approval of the County's Board of Acquisition and Contract, it is expected that independent contracts will be executed between the County and the selected firms.

VI. GENERAL UNDERSTANDINGS

(A) Non-Collusion

The proposer, by signing the proposal, does hereby warrant and represent that any ensuing agreement has not been solicited or secured directly or indirectly in a manner contrary to the laws of the State of New York and the County of Westchester, and that said laws have not been violated and shall not be violated as they relate to the procurement or the performance of the agreement by any conduct, including the paying or giving of any fee, commission, compensation, gift, or gratuity or consideration of any kind, directly or indirectly, to any Westchester County employee, officer or official.

(B) Conflict of Interest

The award of a contract is subject to provisions of all Federal, State and County laws. All firms must disclose with their proposals the name of any officer, director, or agent who is also an employee of the County of Westchester. Further, all firms must disclose the name of any County employee who owns, directly or indirectly, an interest of ten percent (10%) or more in the firm or any of its subsidiaries or affiliates.

(C) Contract

A formal written contract, with specifications, will be entered into between the parties. The proposal, or any part thereof, submitted by the successful proposer may be attached to and become a part of the contract. After selection of the successful proposer, a formal written contract will be drawn by the County of Westchester and will not be binding or in force until approved by the Westchester County Board of Acquisition & Contract, signed by both parties and approved by the Office of the County Attorney. NO RIGHTS SHALL ACCRUE TO ANY PROPOSER BY THE FACT THAT A PROPOSAL HAS BEEN SELECTED BY THE COUNTY FOR SUBMISSION TO THE BOARD OF ACQUISITION & CONTRACT FOR CONTRACT APPROVAL. SAID BOARD HAS THE RIGHT TO REJECT ANY RECOMMENDATION AND THE APPROVAL OF SAID BOARD IS NECESSARY BEFORE A VALID AND BINDING CONTRACT MAY BE EXECUTED BY THE COUNTY.

(D) MBE/WBE Policy

Pursuant to Local Law No. 27-1997, it is the goal of the County to use its best efforts to encourage, promote and increase the participation of business enterprises which are owned and controlled by persons of color or women in contracts and projects funded by the County. Therefore, the County asks Proposers to complete the questionnaire attached hereto as Schedule "B."

(E) MacBride Principles

Pursuant to Act No. 56-1999, no County procuring officer may award or recommend for award any contract not subject to competitive bidding to a proposer that does not execute a certification substantially in the form attached hereto as Schedule "C." Therefore, the County asks Proposers to complete the certification attached hereto as Schedule "C."

(F) Disclosure of Relationships to County

Attached hereto and forming a part hereof as Schedule "D" is a questionnaire entitled "Required Disclosure of Relationships to County." The Proposer agrees to complete said questionnaire.

(G) Qualified Transportation Fringe Program

Executive Order No. 7-2005 requires that contractors, concessionaires and vendors doing business with the County enroll in a Qualified Transportation Fringe Program as defined in §132(f)(1) of the IRS Tax Code for all contracts for services of \$100,000 or more in any twelve month period during the contract term if such contractor, concessionaire or vendor employs more than 25 individuals who utilize public transportation and/or pay for commuter parking at least 1 day per week regardless of whether those employees are engaged in work pursuant to the contract. Proposer shall submit the signed statement which is attached hereto as page 1 of Schedule "E". Notwithstanding the above, Proposer may submit to the Commissioner a Waiver Application in the form attached hereto as page 2 of Schedule "E".

(H) Criminal Background Disclosure

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Executive Order No. 1-2008, the County shall have the right to bar any contractor, consultant, licensee or lessee of County owned real property, their principals, agents, employees, volunteers or any other person acting on behalf of said contractor, consultant, licensee or lessee who is at least sixteen (16) years old from providing work or services to the County or from being on County property if any of the above mentioned persons has either one of the following: (a) A conviction of a crime (all felonies and misdemeanors as defined under the New York State Penal Law or the equivalent under Federal law or the laws of any other State); (b) A pending criminal proceeding for a crime(s) as defined above; or (c) A refusal to answer such questions; where the following criteria apply: (a) If any of the persons providing work or services to the County in relation to a County Contract are not subject to constant monitoring by County staff while performing tasks and/or while such persons are present on County property pursuant to the County Contract; and (b) If any of the persons providing work or services to the County, in relation to a County Contract may, in the course of providing those services, have access to sensitive data (for example, Social Security Numbers and other personal/secure data); facilities (secure facilities and/or communication equipment); and/or vulnerable populations (for example, children, seniors and the infirm).

Proposers that are awarded a contract shall be required to submit a Certification Form and any additional applicable criminal disclosure forms as attached hereto as Schedule "F," along with the executed contract. Notwithstanding the above, a Proposer may qualify for an exemption from Executive Order 1-2008 if: (i) the County has already conducted a background check and issued a security clearance that is in full force and effect for those persons; or (ii) if another state or federal agency having appropriate jurisdiction has conducted a security and/or background clearance or has implemented other protocols or criteria for this purpose that apply to the subject matter of the agreement that is sought by this RFP and the same is in full force and effect.

(I) Proposer Certification

The undersigned agrees and understands that this proposal and all attachments, additional information, etc. submitted herewith constitute merely an offer to negotiate with the County of Westchester and is NOT A BID. Submission of this proposal, attachments, and additional information shall not obligate or entitle the proposing entity to enter into a service agreement with the County of Westchester for the required services. The undersigned agrees and understands that the County of Westchester is not obligated to respond to this proposal nor is it legally bound in any manner whatsoever by the submission of same. It is understood and agreed that the County of Westchester reserves the right to reject consideration of any and all proposals including, but not limited to, proposals which are conditional or incomplete. It is further understood and agreed that the County of Westchester reserves all rights specified in the Request for Proposals.

It is represented and warranted by those submitting this proposal that, except as disclosed in the proposal, no officer or employee of the County of Westchester is directly or indirectly a party to or in any other manner interested in this proposal or any subsequent service agreement that may be entered into.

SCHEDULE "A"

STANDARD INSURANCE PROVISIONS (Consultant)

1. Prior to commencing work, the Consultant shall obtain at its own cost and expense the required insurance from insurance companies licensed in the State of New York, carrying a Best's financial rating of A or better, and shall provide evidence of such insurance to the County of Westchester, as may be required and approved by the Director of Risk Management of the County. The policies or certificates thereof shall provide that thirty days prior to cancellation or material change in the policy, notices of same shall be given to the Director of Risk Management of the County of Westchester by registered mail, return receipt requested, for all of the following stated insurance policies. All notices shall name the Consultant and identify the Agreement.

If at any time any of the policies required herein shall be or become unsatisfactory to the County, as to form or substance, or if a company issuing any such policy shall be or become unsatisfactory to the County, the Consultant shall upon notice to that effect from the County, promptly obtain a new policy, submit the same to the Department of Risk Management of the County of Westchester for approval and submit a certificate thereof. Upon failure of the Consultant to furnish, deliver and maintain such insurance, the Agreement, at the election of the County, may be declared suspended, discontinued or terminated. Failure of the Consultant to take out, maintain, or the taking out or maintenance of any required insurance, shall not relieve the Consultant from any liability under the Agreement, nor shall the insurance requirements be construed to conflict with or otherwise limit the contractual obligations of the Consultant concerning indemnification. All property losses shall be made payable to and adjusted with the County.

In the event that claims, for which the County may be liable, in excess of the insured amounts provided herein are filed by reason of any operations under the Agreement, the amount of excess of such claims or any portion thereof, may be withheld from payment due or to become due the Consultant until such time as the Consultant shall furnish such additional security covering such claims in form satisfactory to the County of Westchester.

2. The Consultant shall provide proof of the following coverage (if additional coverage is required for a specific agreement, those requirements will be described in the "Special Conditions" of the contract specifications):

(a) Workers' Compensation. Certificate form C-105.2 (9/07) or State Fund Insurance Company form U-26.3 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. State Workers' Compensation Board form DB-120.1 is required for proof of compliance with the New York State Disability Benefits Law. Location of operation shall be "All locations in Westchester County, New York."

Where an applicant claims to not be required to carry either a Workers' Compensation Policy or Disability Benefits' Policy, or both, the employer must complete affidavit form WC/DB-100 (revised 9/07), sign and notarize the form, and send to the NYS Workers' Compensation Board for (stamped) approval. The stamped approval (valid for 1 year) should then be provided to the County of Westchester with all other insurance documentation.

If the employer is self-insured for Worker's Compensation, he/she should present a certificate from the New York State Worker's Compensation Board evidencing that fact (Either SI-12, Certificate of Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance, or GSI-105.2, Certificate of Participation in Workers' Compensation Group Self-Insurance).

(b) Employer's Liability with minimum limit of \$100,000.

(c) Commercial General Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence of \$1,000,000 for bodily injury and \$100,000 for property damage or a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 (c.s.1), naming the County of Westchester as an additional insured. This insurance shall include the following coverages:

- (i) Premises - Operations.
- (ii) Broad Form Contractual.
- (iii) Independent Contractor and Sub-Contractor.
- (iv) Products and Completed Operations.

(d) Automobile Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence of \$1,000,000 for bodily injury and a minimum limit of \$100,000 per occurrence for property damage or a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 unless otherwise indicated in the contract specifications. This insurance shall include for bodily injury and property damage the following coverages:

- (i) Owned automobiles.
- (ii) Hired automobiles.
- (iii) Non-owned automobiles.

(e) Consultant's Professional Liability. The Consultant shall provide proof of such insurance. (Limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence/\$3,000,000 aggregate).

3. All policies of the Consultant shall be endorsed to contain the following clauses:

(a) Insurers shall have no right to recovery or subrogation against the County of Westchester (including its employees and other agents and agencies), it being the intention of the parties that the insurance policies so effected shall protect both parties and be primary coverage for any and all losses covered by the above-described insurance.

(b) The clause "other insurance provisions" in a policy in which the County of Westchester is named as an insured, shall not apply to the County of Westchester.

(c) The insurance companies issuing the policy or policies shall have no recourse against the County of Westchester (including its agents and agencies as aforesaid) for payment of any premiums or for assessments under any form of policy.

(d) Any and all deductibles in the above described insurance policies shall be assumed by and be for the account of, and at the sole risk of, the Consultant.

SCHEDULE "C"

CERTIFICATION REGARDING BUSINESS DEALINGS WITH NORTHERN IRELAND

A. The Contractor and any individual or legal entity in which the Contractor holds a ten percent (10%) or greater ownership interest and any individual or legal entity that holds a ten percent (10%) or greater ownership interest in the Contractor (a) has no business operations in Northern Ireland, or (b) shall take lawful steps in good faith to conduct any business operations in Northern Ireland in accordance with the MacBride Principles.

B. For purposes of this Certification, "MacBride Principles" shall mean those principles relating to nondiscrimination in employment and freedom of workplace opportunity which require employers doing business in Northern Ireland to:

- (1) increase the representation of individuals from underrepresented religious groups in the work force, including managerial, supervisory, administrative, clerical and technical jobs;
- (2) take steps to promote adequate security for the protection of employees from underrepresented religious groups both at the workplace and while traveling to and from work;
- (3) ban provocative religious or political emblems from the workplace;
- (4) publicly advertise all job openings and make special recruitment efforts to attract applicants from underrepresented religious groups;
- (5) establish layoff, recall and termination procedures which do not in practice favor a particular religious group;
- (6) abolish all job reservations, apprenticeship restrictions and differential employment criteria which discriminate on the basis of religion;
- (7) develop training programs that will prepare substantial numbers of current employees from underrepresented religious groups for skilled jobs, including the expansion of existing programs and the creation of new programs to train, upgrade and improve the skills of workers from underrepresented religious groups;

C. For purposes of this Certification, "Northern Ireland" shall be understood to be the six counties partitioned from the Irish Province of Ulster, and administered from London and/or from Stormont.

D. The Contractor agrees that the warranties and representation in paragraph "A" are material conditions of this Agreement. If the County receives information that the Contractor is in violation of paragraph "A", the County shall review such information and give the Contractor opportunity to respond. If the County finds that such a violation has occurred, the County may declare the Contractor in default, and/or terminate this Agreement. In the event of any such termination, the County may procure the supplies, services or work from another source in accordance with applicable law. The Contractor shall pay to the County the difference between the contract price for the uncompleted portion of this Agreement and the cost to the County of completing performance of this Agreement either by itself or by engaging another Contractor. If this is a contract other than a construction contract, the Contractor shall

be liable for the difference in price if the cost of procurement from another source is greater than what the County would have paid the Contractor plus any reasonable costs the County incurs in any new procurement and if this is a construction contract, the County shall also have the right to hold the Contractor in partial or total default in accordance with the default provisions of this Agreement. In addition, the Contractor may be declared not to be a responsible bidder or proposer for up to three (3) years, following written notice to the Contractor, giving the Contractor the opportunity for a hearing at which the Contractor may be represented by counsel. The rights and remedies of the County hereunder shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any rights and remedies the County has pursuant to this Agreement or by operation of law or in equity.
