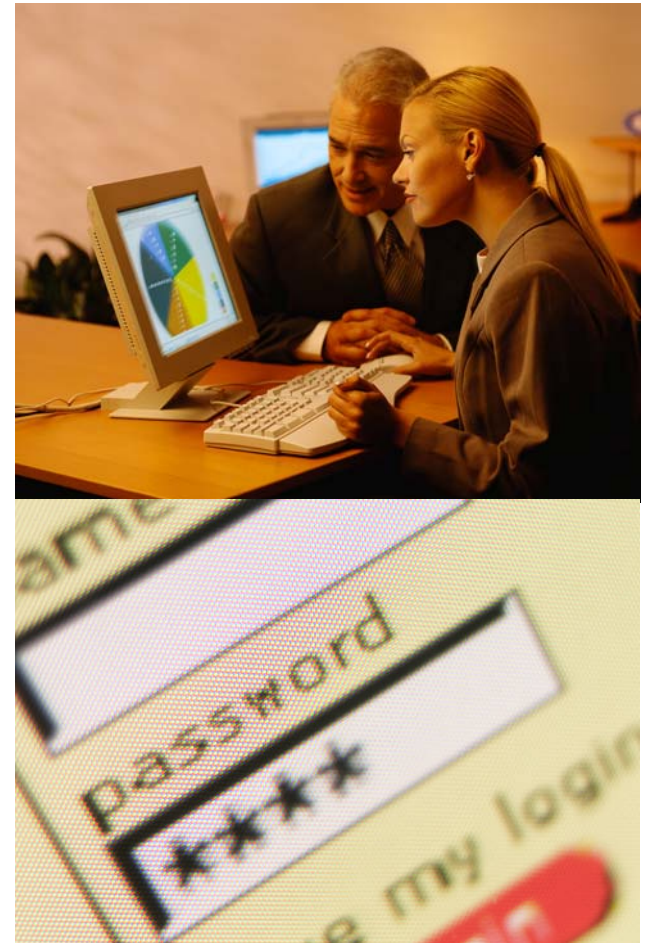

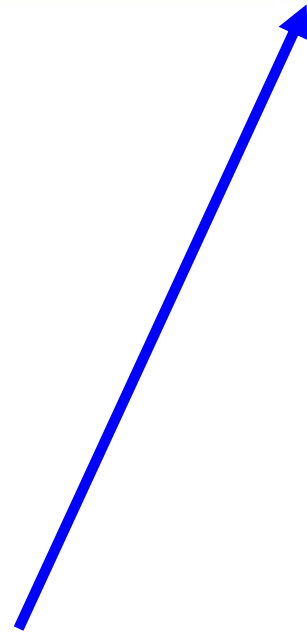

# Program Format

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- ❑ Each course is divided into sections and includes a syllabus for content guidance.
- ❑ Courses may include any combination of text, video, audio and presentation media.
- ❑ Notification of any needed plug and play downloads will be made upon enrolling in a course.

# Course Navigation

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- ❑ Within each presentation, instructions will be listed indicating what steps are to be taken next.
- ❑ If you must leave in the middle of a presentation, remember where you have left off. *This system will signify what course sections you have accessed but it will not bring you back to where you left off last.*

# Course Completion



- When you have completed all of the sections, you will be eligible to take the test (if required).
