(3) 20-44 ug/dl: High elevation of lead in blood; 45-69 ug/dl: Urgent elevation; 70 ug/dl or more: Emergency elevation.

(4) Unable to classify; includes test results which were questionable, clotted or the results of a lab accident

(5) Registry cases include children determined to be lead poisoned (confirmed BLL &gt; 20 ug/dl) that received case management services (nursing visits, environmental inspections, follow-up, referral) for some part of 1999. Out of county registry cases were provided environmental services for buildings they occupied in Westchester.

(6) Includes incomplete addresses as well as addresses consisting only of P.O. Boxes and Rural Delivery Routes. In all cases these contain Westchester ZIP codes or post office references.
