Accelerated Bachelor of Science and Dual Degrees

"Manhattanville Castle Scholarship Awards" are limited in number. Each award reduces tuition 30%. Students twenty-three years of age and above who have at least two years of relevant work experience may be accepted into the program based on the admissions criterion established for the Accelerated Bachelor of Science Degree and Dual Degree programs. These career-oriented programs help adult students complete their undergraduate degrees part-time in an accelerated format. Each 120-credit BS program includes up to 60-75 transfer credits and may be completed within two years. Dual Degree-eligible students may take up to five graduate courses, which will be applied to both the undergraduate and graduate degrees. Admissions for Bachelor of Science and Dual Degree programs

To be eligible for the Bachelor of Science and Dual Degree programs, students must be at least 23 years old and have a minimum of two years relevant work experience. In addition, students must have either completed an Associate's degree or accumulated between 60 and 75 undergraduate credits toward a Bachelor's Degree with a 2.5 GPA or better. Students who do not have the 60 credits or the prerequisite courses may make them up in the regular college curriculum.

New modules begin in September, November, January, February and April. Applications are accepted throughout the year under Manhattanville's rolling admissions policy.
