DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF ENVIRONMENTAL FACILITIES

Westchester County Government has an opening for a Deputy Commissioner of Environmental Facilities to act for and on behalf of the Commissioner in the overall administration, oversight and planning of all departmental operations as they pertain to engineering, operations and facilities management. The Department of Environmental Facilities maintains a 24/7 operation with seven wastewater resource recovery facilities, three staffed pump stations, two water districts as well as numerous and varied ancillary facilities. The bulk of the operations comes from our large tertiary treatment plants, which boast the highest level of classification; 4a, accounting for nearly 130 million gallons of wastewater cleaned per day. Our water districts are classified as IIB and can produce up to 30 million gallons of clean water per day.

The incumbent will direct the research, planning, design and construction of all new facilities and expansion/repair of existing ones as well as administratively supervise nearly 300 engineering, programmatic and operational employees involved in the daily operations of all County-owned facilities. Further, an incumbent will be substantially involved in developing the \$80 million capital budget and \$145 million operating budget, as well as overseeing staff responsible for the five-year capital plan for Environmental Facilities projects and in formulating policy and program outlines for departmental operations.

Possession of a New York State Professional Engineer's license and six years of experience in the field of sanitary engineering, at least four years of which must have been in the planning, design, construction and operation of sewer or water treatment plants and lines is required.
