The Position

The Director of Real Property Tax Services is a professional and administrative position responsible for directing a county advisory tax service and appraisal division for city and town assessors and the county equalization agency. The Director must provide accurate, timely information and advice on real property appraisal, equalization, and assessment. The work is performed under the general direction of the County Treasurer and is subject to general review by the State Board of Equalization and Assessment. Appointment is made by the Oswego County Legislature for a 6-year term.

Primary responsibilities include:

- Maintains tax maps that serve as base maps for Geographic Information System (GIS);
- Maintains and administers the Real Property Tax Services website, with assessment data for consumers, and the Real Property System (RPS) software used by Oswego County municipalities;
- Produces and maintains assessments rolls;
- Provides advisory appraisals to the County and/or local assessors;
- Serves school districts and local municipalities in the preparation of levy and apportionment data;
- Provides Impact Notices and Change of Assessment notices for all municipalities in Oswego County;
- Coordinates training for local assessors, Board of Assessment Review members, and other assessment administrative personnel through newsletters, phone, correspondence, etc.;
- May assist in the sale of real property acquired by tax sale;
- Serves as the clearing house for the collection and distribution of information relating to the assessment of real property;
- Conducts a public auction, annually, for the sale of county-owned tax property.

Minimum Qualifications for Director of Real Property Tax Services



Graduation from high school or possession of an accredited high school equivalency diploma, and 8 years of full-time paid experience in an occupation providing a good knowledge of real property values and the principles, methods, and procedures required for the assessment of real property for tax purposes, such as assessor, principal in an appraisal firm, director of a mass appraisal project, administrative position in the office of real property tax services or real property tax agent. As a part of the foregoing work experience, or in connection with any other work experience, candidates must have had at least 3 years of full-time paid administrative experience involving the responsibility of planning, organizing, and directing a work program; **OR** Graduation from an accredited two-year college and 7 years of the above experience; **OR** Graduation from an accredited four-year college and 6 years of the above experience. **NOTE:** One year of graduate study may be substituted for 1 year of the foregoing experience. No more than 2 years of graduate study may be applied as a substitute for the foregoing experience. In no case shall less than four 4 years of experience in an occupation providing a good knowledge of real property values and the principles, methods and procedures required for the assessment of real property tax purposes be acceptable.
