

## PATHOLOGIST II

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: Under direct supervision of a full-time Medical Examiner performs autopsies as assigned. May assist in the performance of autopsies of a difficult nature. May be required to testify in court of law as witness for autopsies performed or witnessed. Does related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Provides part-time pathological services as required;

Conducts autopsies;

Discusses all autopsies performed with the full-time Medical Examiner in charge detailing procedure, observations, and findings.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND ATTRIBUTES: Thorough knowledge of principles, literature, methods, techniques and new developments in the field of pathology; good knowledge of Forensic Pathology; skill in the use of diversified specialized equipment, instruments, and materials required in all phases of pathology; ability to detect, analyze, evaluate and interpret manifestations and symptoms of physical conditions from pathological examinations; judgment; initiative; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: Graduation from an approved medical school\* plus completion of at least two years of residency training in Anatomic Pathology with experience in Forensic Pathology.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: License to practice medicine in New York State; Certification by the American Board of Pathology in Anatomic Pathology.

\*SPECIAL NOTE: Education beyond the secondary level must be from an institution recognized or accredited by the Board of Regents of the New York State Education Department as a post-secondary, degree-granting institution.
