

MAINTENANCE LABORER
(SCHOOL DISTRICTS)

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: Under direct supervision, incumbents in this class perform a variety of routine unskilled tasks required in the maintenance of school district grounds. During inclement weather, incumbents perform a variety of routine maintenance and repair tasks inside school buildings. Does related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Mows, reseeds, rolls, and fertilizes lawns and athletic fields;

Cares for flowerbeds;

Rakes leaves and hauls away rubbish;

Trims hedges, trees and shrubs;

Operates a variety of grounds maintenance equipment;

Shovels or plows snow and ice from sidewalks and driveways;

Patches blacktop on sidewalks and driveways;

Cleans gutters and catch basins;

Performs miscellaneous routine maintenance and repair tasks inside school buildings during inclement weather and winter months;

May perform other incidental tasks, as needed.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND ATTRIBUTES: Ability to follow oral instructions; ability to get along well with others; ability to read, write, speak, understand and communicate in English sufficiently to perform the essential duties of the position; willingness to perform routine manual work; industrious in work performance; physical endurance and agility; physical condition commensurate with the duties of the position.

MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: None.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT FOR APPOINTMENT IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS: In accordance with the Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE) legislation, Chapter 180 of the Laws of 2000, and by the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, candidates for appointment in school districts must obtain clearance for employment from the State Education Department prior to employment based upon a fingerprint and criminal history background check.
