MAINTENANCE WORKER (POOL)

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: Under supervision of the Superintendent of Recreation, incumbents in this class perform a variety of maintenance, laboring, cleaning and other support activities in connection with the upkeep and repair of a public recreational pool for a municipality or school district. Work assignments are initiated via oral instructions or written work orders. Incumbents are expected to deal with routine work problems as they arise and use judgment in determining when situations should be referred to a supervisor for direction. Supervision is not a function of this class. Does related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative Only)

Checks water readings, filters, pump valves, tanks, valves, gauges, and vents daily;

Measures and corrects water chemical balance;

Vacuums pool daily;

Cleans strainer;

Assists in the inspection and maintenance of filtration systems, including replacing pulley belts;

Maintains and polices locker rooms, bath and shower areas;

Cleans hallways, floors, windows, and storm drains;

May use computer applications or other automated systems such as spreadsheets, word processing, calendar, e-mail and database software in performing work assignments;

May perform other incidental tasks, as needed.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND ATTRIBUTES: Knowledge of the machines, tools, chemicals, and terminology required to operate a public recreational pool; ability to read and interpret manuals and regulations; ability to get along well with others; ability to follow written and oral instructions; ability to read, write, speak, understand, and communicate in English sufficiently to perform the essential duties of the position; ability to use computer applications such as spreadsheets, word processing, calendar, e-mail and/or database software; initiative in successfully completing work; and physical condition commensurate with the duties of the position.

MINIMUM ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: Graduation from high school or equivalency diploma and either: (a) one year experience where the primary function of the position was in the general repair and maintenance of a commercial or public pool or (b) possession a Certified Pool/Spa Operator certificate (CPO).

<u>NOTE</u>: Unless otherwise noted, only experience gained after attaining the minimum education level indicated in the minimum qualifications will be considered in evaluating experience.
