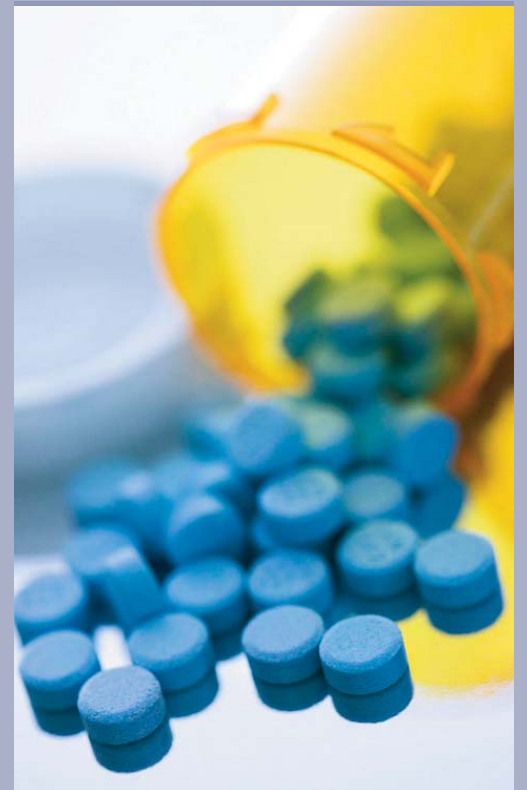


Don't throw away your old medications!

Bring them to Westchester's Household Recycling Day



- Left-over or expired prescription and over-the-counter medications can end up in the hands of children or teens or leach into our drinking water.
- Protect your family and the environment by disposing of them properly.
DO NOT pour them down the drain or flush them down the toilet.
- Bring pills, liquids, ointments and lotions to any Household Recycling Day.
Keep them in the original container or put them in a sealable plastic bag.
Liquid medications should be in their containers *and* inside sealable plastic bags.
