Westchester County residents can dispose of their unused medications at the county's Household Recycling Day events.

- Left-over or expired prescription and over-the-counter medications can end up in the hands of children or teens or leach into our drinking water.
- Protect your family and the environment by disposing of them properly.
- **DO NOT** pour them down the drain or flush them down the toilet.
- Bring pills, liquids, ointments and lotions as well as pet medications in their original containers or a sealed plastic bag to any Household Recycling Day. Liquids must be placed in a sealable bag in addition to their original packaging.
